An animal cell will typically range between 10 and 30 micrometers in length, while a plant cell can reach 100 micrometers in length. Plant cells are larger because they contain vacuoles that store water. Animal cells also have vacuoles, but these organelles aren't used to store water. The cell wall is another important difference. Animal cells are protected by a cell membrane.
