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Results: Results of correlation analyses revealed that role overload was significantly related to work-family conflict and emotional exhaustion and work-family conflict was significantly related to emotional exhaustion.

Findings. -. The results of SEM suggest that emotional exhaustion functions as a full mediator of the effects of work overload, work-family conflict, and family-work conflict on job embeddedness and job performance. Specifically, employees who have heavy workloads and are unable to establish a balance between work (family) and family (work) roles are emotionally exhausted.

Employees who have work overload and work-family conflicts are more likely to experience emotionally exhausted; and high levels of emotional exhaustion may result in employee withdrawal intentions...

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Peeters, de Jonge, Janssen, and van der Linden (2004) note that those with higher levels of work-family conflict might experience poorer health, greater absenteeism, and/or poorer work performance, which, over time might eventually result in their being placed in lower quality jobs characterized by greater demands and fewer resources (i.e., the drift hypothesis).

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Accordingly, work family conflicts, perceived work overload are the main antecedents of work exhaustion that shape the behavior of an employee towards the job whether positive or negative and influence the loyalty towards organization and in turn influence decision to stay with the organization (Jamal, 2010; Noor & Maad, 2008).

Research on work-family balance indicates that inter-role conflict and role overload are common in employed adults and are associated with reduced job satisfaction and performance, as well as with increased absenteeism, job turnover, depression and burnout [15-19].

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However, much less is known about the impact of technology overload on work-family conflict (WFC). Formally defined, WFC is “a form of inter-role conflict in which the role pressures from the work and family domains are mutually incompatible in some respect.

Also, higher levels of family-related social support are related to lower levels of family-to-work conflict. In contrast, higher levels of time devoted to work responsibilities, higher levels of psychological importance attributed to work, and the experience of work stressors (e.g., work overload, conflicting demands at work) are associated with higher levels of work-to-family conflict.
